
The program for January will be a presentation by Douglas K. Williams, PMP (a.k.a. Dugger) a Senior Consultant. His topic will be "Troubled Project Analysis - Common Project Failure Triggers". Reaching into the Information Technology industry's history, the Standish Group International has analyzed project-centric success rates. As documented within The CHAOS Report (1994), nearly one-third of all IT projects were cancelled before completion, close to one-half ran almost twice over budget, and less than one-quarter were delivered on-time and within budget. Their update, Extreme CHAOS (2001), showed that nearly one-fourth of projects failed, almost one-half were challenged, and just over one-quarter were successful.

With this in mind, consider your project portfolio. Will one or more of your most critical projects succeed, or disappoint? The industry statistics demonstrate the latter is much more likely. Doug's project management presentation reviews a checklist of many common project failure triggers one should consider when looking at a project and its ability to succeed.

Recap Last Month's Meeting


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Website Usage Statistics - by Darin A. Hart.
