PMI is moving towards publication of the Practice Standard for Scheduling and has posted online the exposure draft for review and recommendations. The standard was developed to reflect the latest in current scheduling practice. The standard expands on the project schedule model concept first introduced in A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge (PMBOK® Guide)—Third Edition. It breaks out all of the components of the schedule model and explains each component's behavior as well as the good practices associated with its use.

Course Description:

Project Procurement Management: This course provides students a detailed view of the processes used to acquire resources, to complete projects, and to ensure fulfillment of requirements. Students are introduced to the procurement acquisition and contract processes of project management, and to the details on contract administration. A systematic approach will aid students in developing an in-depth understanding of procurement and contracting issues from the standpoint of both buyers and sellers of products and services needed to complete project work.
