Introduction to Program Management Workshop

Course Description:

Program Management Workshop: When in a program environment, the processes and skills needed to direct a program differ from that of traditional project management. This course explains the key terms and themes of program management while highlighting the differences between managing programs and managing projects. It also introduces Program Management Best Practices that are recognized by the industry as the most successful for managing programs. The course includes a number of real world exercises and case studies to familiarize Program Managers with the complexities and every day issues of Program Management. Participants will gain an understanding of each program management phase and how to effectively plan, guide, and coordinate the tasks and activities within each phase. Specific examples are used throughout the workshop to reinforce program management principles and concepts. This course is aligned with PMI's "Standard for Program Management" and *A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge* (PMBOK® Guide) - Third Edition, published by the Project Management Institute (PMI®), Inc., 2004.

Learning Objectives: Understand the breadth of Program Management! Each student will understand the concepts necessary to formally manage programs and pursue the Program Management Professional certification (PgMP). Attendees who are Project Management Professionals (PMPs) will receive 4 Professional Development Unit credits with the PMI under category 4.
