Program: "Applying Reflective Practices to Improve Lessons Learned" by Doug Williams, PMP

Doug's presentation provides a deliberate focus on improving project "lessons learned" exercises. Lessons learned exercises are team events that are typically worked after a project phase, milestone, or deliverable is completed. They are traditionally based on project participant memory and less on documented project events. The exercises also tend to be negatively influenced and obscured by what is happening "today" rather than reflective of actual conditions that existed during the project. This presentation details an approach to improve lessons learned exercises for every project. The presentation helps advance a project manager's use of the project issues log, risk register, and change management log in order to be more supportive to the lessons learned activity. The presentation also helps the overall organization to analyze and to understand the behavioral perspectives for how things go wrong during projects so that more decisive corrective actions may be pursued.

Certification Tips - Annual PDU Earnings

Are you sometimes confused on how the PDU earnings process works? The following is a good summary of annual PDU earnings information that was received from Adam Potts at the Global PMI Head-quarters in Philadelphia PA, in response to a recertification renewal question:

- PMPs are not required to complete a specific amount of PDUs per year during their threeyear PMP cycle.
- The only requirement is that the 60 required PDUs be completed during the cycle and no later than the expiration date.
- When a PMP crosses the 60 PDU threshold, PMI automatically notifies the applicant for renewal.
- This application process has been online since the end of 2005.
- Additional PDUs earned in a renewal cycle are approved toward the next renewal based on the transfer guidelines only.
- Up to 20 excess PDUs earned during the final year of the current CCR three-year cycle may be applied to the next CCR three-year cycle.
- Transfer is also done automatically. PMPs should report these excess PDUs normally. The PMI Records office will do the rest.

Note: The PMI Records office will record all PDU claims submitted by a PMP even if they are not applicable to the individual's requirements, such as an excess credit claim in the first year which does not qualify for PDU transfer.

Critical Chain Project Management: A Better Critical Path using MS Project

Course Description:

Critical Chain Project Management: A Better Critical Path using MS Project: In the last 50 years of project management, since the "Gantt" and "PERT" methodologies were developed, there has only been one major breakthrough in project scheduling. This breakthrough is called "Critical Chain Project Management" pioneered in 1997 by Dr. Eli Goldratt of the Goldratt institute. This course gives participants a full understanding of the CCPM techniques, tools, and theory. Participants develop critical chain solutions in MS Project and apply them to all types of projects. Participants learn buffer management techniques for avoiding the common pitfalls of buffer management. Skills learned in this course are beneficial for meeting project time and cost commitments for every project.

This course has the following objectives:

- Understand how Critical Chain Project Management (CCPM) is a better critical path
- Understand how projects can be completed 50% faster &/or cheaper
- Understand how to develop CCPM schedules
- Understand how projects can be completed on-time vs. national average of only 44% on-time
- Understand how projects can be completed on-budget vs. national average of 189% over-budget
- Understand Critical Chain Buffer Management techniques
- Understand how to manage multiple projects using the CCPM Pipeline
