



The key points from the article:

- Believe in what you do One of the best ways to engender enthusiasm is to talk about the positive aspects of your project. This will help get people excited about their work and enable that feeling to spread throughout the team.
- Show a sense of urgency A good way to fire up your team is to create a feeling of importance around project tasks. If there's a lack of passion, institute slightly more ambitious deadlines. Raising the stakes should raise your team's focus and energy.
- Be willing to take on increased responsibilities The next time someone asks you to help them with a task, go beyond what's required.
- Strive for excellence Nothing breeds enthusiasm like a job well done. If you've allowed yourself to
 ease off when it comes to quality standards, redouble efforts to do things according to your highest levels of excellence.

The biggest takeaway I got from this article was the reminder that as a Project Manager not only does your team look to you for leadership and direction but that they also can be energized or de-energized by your behavior.

I also wanted to provide an update that our board and director transitions for 2008 are complete and the team is working to finalize our goals and budget for 2008. 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Certification Tips - Reporting PMI Eastern Iowa Chapter Meeting Attendance for PMP PDUs

Note that the PMI Eastern lowa Chapter does not track PMP meeting attendance for purposes of PMP PDU reporting. As with all PDU reporting, this is up to the individual.

However, it is handy to print the current table of chapter meetings from the Eastern lowa Chapter site prior to going to the PMI site.

Open the Eastern Iowa Chapter website: http://pmieasterniowa.org

In the list of menus on the left side of the home page, click on Calendar.

On the Calendar screen, scroll down and click on the **Calendar Archive** to display the Past Chapter Meetings table that you can print: http://pmieasterniowa.org/calendar archive.htm

Now go to the Global PMI home page at www.pmi.org: http://www.pmi.org/Pages/default.aspx

At the upper left corner of the screen, click on "Secure Sign In"

On the "Enter Username and Password" screen enter your:

- PMI Membership Number
- PMI Password (assigned by PMI when you received your membership/renewal)

Click on "Log In"

Once logged into PMI as a member, go to the left side of the screen in your "Certification Status" block and click on "View PDUs".

On the PMP login screen called **"Continuing Certification Requirements Online PDU Resources"**, login as a PMP member with your:

- PMI Membership Number
- PMP Certification Number
- PMP Password (the first four (4) characters of your last name)
- Click on radio button "PMI PDU Self Report Form"

Click on "LOGIN"

This brings up the "PMP Activity Report" screen which asks "What activity do you wish to claim?". Click on the down arrow and select "PDU Category 3" from the list and proceed to enter your chapter meeting data. Continue claiming each Chapter Meeting in the same way until they are all recorded.

Important Notes on Date Formatting:

For PMP PDU online activity reporting, PMI uses the <u>international date format</u>: DD/MM/YYYY. Example: the first Fourth of July in the U.S. was 04/07/1776 in the international date format. DD/MM/YYYY - The international format for dates, which PMI uses for PDU reporting. MM/DD/YYYY - The U.S.A. format for dates must be converted to the international format.

Project Cost and Earned Value Management Workshop

Course Description:

Project Cost and Earned Value Management Workshop: This course examines project costing by providing participants with cost estimation techniques and tools to manage project cost. It demonstrates how resource planning, cost estimating, cost budgeting, and cost control are applied to ensure that a project is completed within the approved budget and schedule. Participants will also become familiarized with a number of powerful cost management tools that will allow them to forecast and influence future project cost success. Included in the class are a number of real world exercises that take you from cost estimation at the beginning of a project through the challenges of ongoing cost management throughout the project. After completing this course, participants will understand the following:

- Analogous, Parametric, and Bottom-up Estimating how to use information from previous projects, industry standards, and the WBS to estimate costs for a new project
- Life-Cycle Costing how to estimate the costs of long-term and multi-year projects Time-Phased Budgeting how
 to prepare a project cost baseline that will be used to measure and monitor cost performance during project
 execution
- Earned Value Project Management a better cost management methodology
- Return on Investment (ROI), Net Present Value (NPV), Discounted Cash Flows (DCF), Investment Payback Analysis (IPA), Internal Rate of Return (IRR)
