## Certification Tips - Remember to Renew Your CAPM<sup>®</sup> Credential

For the first time, Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM) credential holders are coming up for renewal in 2008. The CAPM acknowledges the professional dedication of project team members who contribute to project teams from many different perspectives.

CAPM holders maintain their credential by studying the updates that have occurred over the last five years to A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge (PMBOK<sup>®</sup> Guide)—Third Edition. This assures their employers that they have stayed current in their knowledge of project management.

The CAPM holder must <u>renew her/his credential during the fifth year</u> of the cycle, before the credential expires. In order to renew, she/he must <u>re-take and pass the examination</u>.

PDUs are not required to maintain the CAPM credential.





#### **Course Description:**

**PMO Portfolio Management and Organizational Project Management Governance:** The PMO is known as the "Program Management Office" or the "Project Management Center of Excellence". It is the group that maintains project management standards in an organization. In most organizations, approximately 80% of projects fail. The PMO is a powerful element for identifying struggling projects early in the project life cycle and working with project teams to get projects back on track. If a project does fail, the PMO analyzes the reasons for project failure and then orchestrates updates to processes and procedures to insure project success in the future. This course demonstrates how the PMO is used to evaluate new project proposals to determine if they align with the organization's strategic and tactical plans. It shows how the PMO evaluates organizational project execution to determine if projects, programs, and portfolios are performing as required. It also gives guidance on best practices for presiding over the different levels of Management Reviews (e.g. project, program, portfolio, enterprise, etc.). The tools and techniques demonstrated in the class will help organizations select the right projects and deliver them successfully.

Learning Objectives: The following are the objectives for this course:

- Establish a PMO process methodology to evaluate, select, and prioritize projects
- Create a governance body for projects in the organization
- Compile portfolio cost, schedule, and resource data for organizational reporting
- Understand portfolio cost and schedule problems that can detrimentally to the organization
- Monitor portfolio resource pools and the project pipeline
- Conduct periodic portfolio management reviews of projects in the organization
- · Identify and manage the project risks in your portfolio
- Monitor portfolios changes
